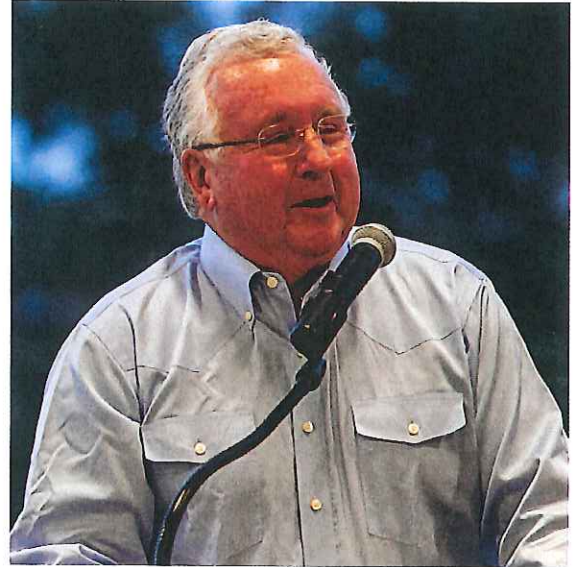
Saddle Up for the Shea Center
